




This is a cross-cutting opportunity for Arkansas to advance health equity through strategies, interventions, and services that have put certain groups at higher risk for diseases like COVID-19.

Arkansas's tax system is regressive, which means that those with lower incomes pay more as a share of their income in state and local taxes than those with higher incomes. • Increase funding for the state's Arkansas Better Chance pre-school program to allow more children to enroll

Quality early childhood education is critical to the health development of children and it plays an important role in our economy. Increased funding for the Arkansas Better Chance (ABC) program that provides pre-K education for 3 and 4 year olds. The estimated state share needed to reach all low-income Arkansan families with children in this age range

Many Arkansans, especially those with disabilities, experience significant barriers to participating in the voting process. Establishing online voter registration would expand access to the voting process for many.

Our Approach.

IYEP is a successful, evidence-based program with a focus on educational and mployment outcomes for youth (16-24). Core program components include: 2-4 week career readiness programming, occupational skills training, case nanagement, educational interventions and support, service learning projects, paid internships (where possible), and mentoring. Although UYEP has focused on serving youth who have had criminal justice system involvement, the program model has its roots in, and is adaptable to, serving disadvantaged youth more broadly.



IYEP enables the National Urban gue to improve outco 's costs, improve the au ent available to employers, and interrupt a multi-generational cycle of poverty for youths and their families

The Urban Youth **Empowerment Program** uses a holistic approach to prepare Opportunity Youth for pathways to economic stability through a comprehensive set of services, including:

- Career readiness and placement
- Educational offerings,
- Mentorship
- Restorative justice projects/ service learning projects
- Community-wide efforts to reduce activities of violence
- Access to support services.




