No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and been seven Years a Citizen
and who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.
Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union, as
shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including those bound to Service for a Term of

These trainings will engage grassroots Urban League members and residents, and will focus on SNAP and asset limit education, and messaging.

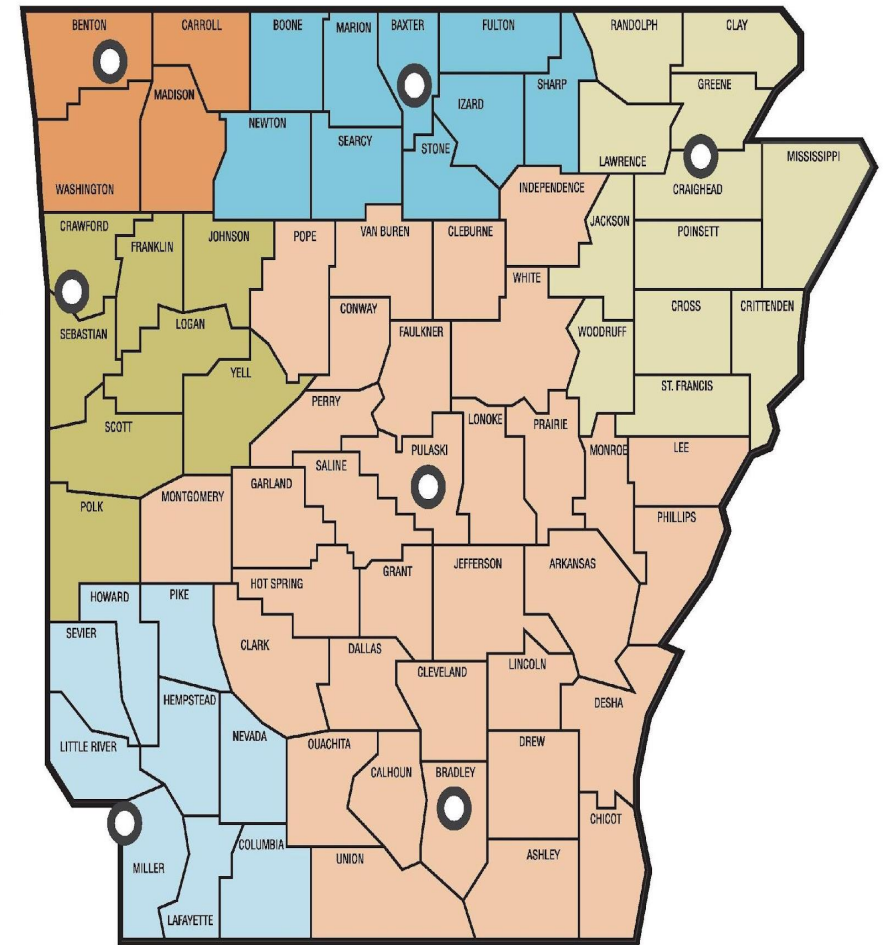

THE PROGRAM IS:

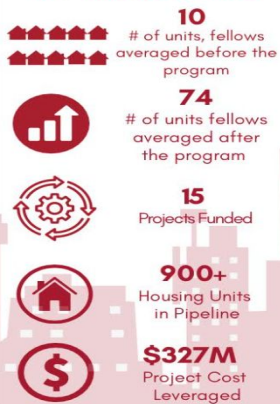
- an economic development driver - adding more affordable housing and reducing the burden on residents.

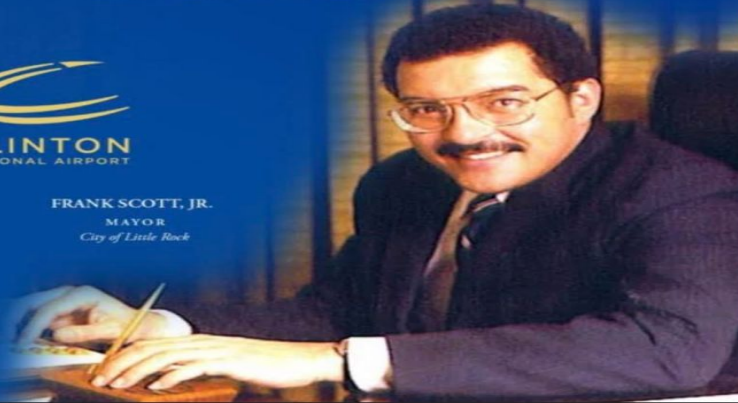

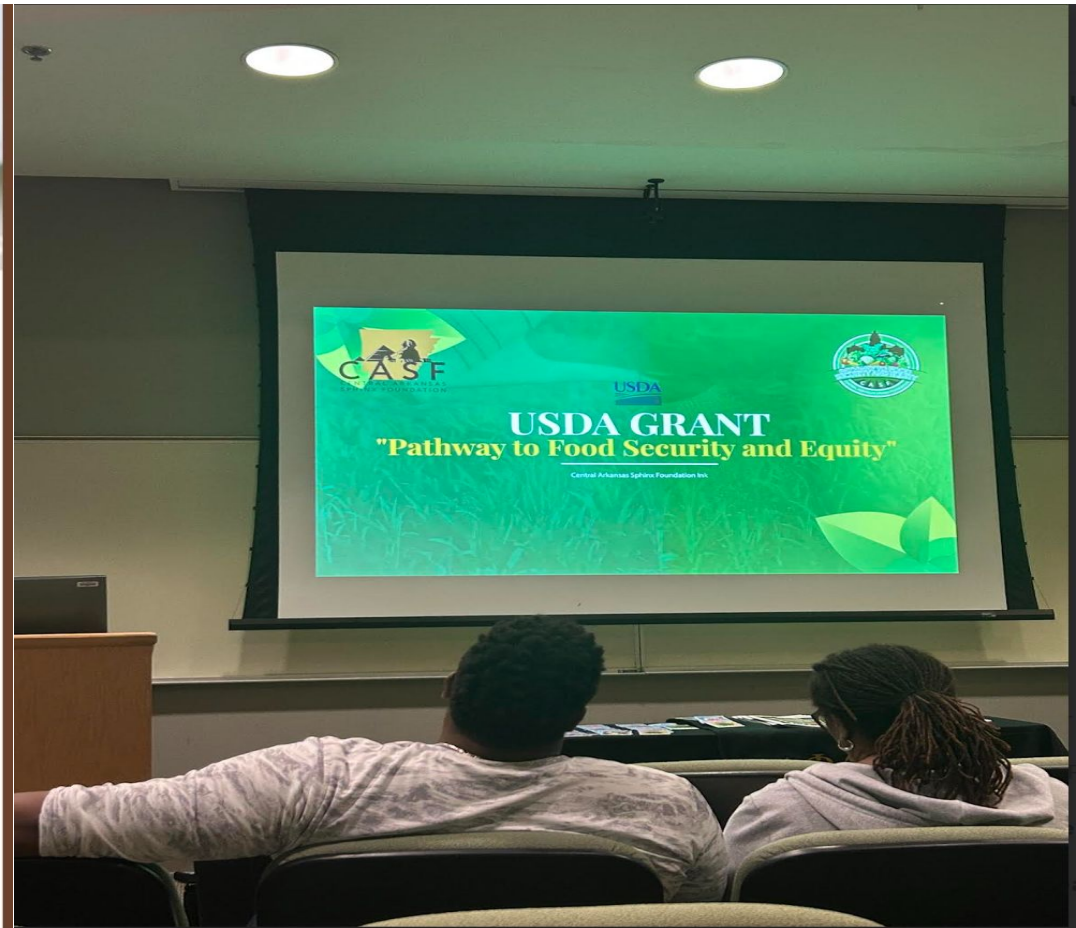
